Collaborative Leadership

The challenges of today’s government environment require collaborative leadership skills more now than ever before. This course is designed to enhance the impact and influence you bring to the work of government when collaborative and interdependent leadership skills are required. Set in the context of peer-to-peer leadership, this course will define and shape your mandate for leadership and collaboration regardless of your formal or informal position of authority or leadership in your organization.

- Explore individual differences and the contributions that diverse styles and perspectives lend to collaboration, problem solving, and entrepreneurial thought
- Apply collaborative approaches to framing issues, broadening perspectives, and analyzing alternative strategies with a real organizational improvement issue from the workplace
- Discover how to restructure difficult conversations into learning conversations
- Identify and employ mental models and specific skills needed to support organizational collaboration
- Combine positive interpersonal skills and influence to solve problems and lead collaboratively
- Strengthen the commitment to public service and federal leadership

This two-week course offers invaluable skill-building in interpersonal relationships, managing difficult conversations, and group problem solving and decision-making. It is a key step to excellence in collaborative, interdependent leadership.

A key learning strategy for this course is applying learnings to a real organizational issue. Participants will be asked to identify with their supervisor a problem, issue, or unrealized opportunity for organizational improvement. This will form the basis of a project to apply the collaborative mindset during and after the course.

This is also offered in a residential/online format consisting of a one week residential program and five weeks online. Following the residential portion, participants meet weekly online for a one hour webinar. Preparation time for each webinar is approximately two hours a week.

- Explore differences between collaboration, cooperation, and partnering; and barriers to collaboration
- Acquire a framework for difficult conversations and learn how to turn them into learning conversations.
- Increase your ability to influence others regardless of your positional authority
