Leading Through Difficult Changes: Lessons of the Civil Rights Movement

You are invited to participate in our September 21 - 24 2015 Leadership for a Democratic Society Alumni-Only Course, "Leading Through Difficult Changes: Lessons of the Civil Rights Movement." The course will be delivered in Montgomery, Alabama and will tour historic sites in Birmingham and Selma, Alabama.

Leading change is difficult, and it is essential leaders are aware of the challenges they may face as they undertake significant organizational change efforts. This course uses powerful lessons from the Civil Rights Movement as a case study to develop critical skills necessary to lead change even when faced with what seems to be overwhelming resistance. Participants will delve into the theories of how to lead change ethically and to build a stronger organizational culture through the lens of a significant period of American history.
